# Proper Disposal of **Medications**



Do you have medicines that you no longer need?

The Federal Drug Administration (FDA) recommends that when your medications are no longer needed they should be disposed of promptly. Consumers and caregivers should remove expired, unwanted or unused medicines from their home as quickly as possible to help reduce the chance that others accidentally take or intentionally misuse the unneeded medicine, and to help reduce drugs from entering the environment.

The Swinomish Police Department is now a permanent drop-off location for drug disposal. It is open Monday through Friday, 8:30am - 5:00pm and is located at 17353 Reservation Road (360-466-7237). No liquid prescriptions are allowed, but information is available on how to safely dispose of them. The program is free and anonymous.

#### **Regular Meeting of June 20, 2018**

- 1) Certified the results of the Annual Membership Meeting and Election held on May 19, 2018.
- 2) Adopted Resolution 18-09 revising the Building Construction Guidelines to remove the damage deposit requirement for Propane Tank and Heat Pump installations and revising the Site Work Permit to ensure lot drainage is directed to the Community's drainage system.
- Adopted Resolution 18-10 updating the Community Fee Schedule based on the Member ratified FY 2018-2019 Operating and Capital Improvement Projects Budget.
- 4) In response to the Community entering into a Sublease for the Marina, adopted Resolution 18-11 amending the FY 2018-2019 Annual Budget to include the Marina operation.
- 5) Received the 2018 Election Committee's Debriefing Report. With their mission complete, the Election Committee was sunsetted with much appreciation for their work.
- 6) Approved an expense authorization to enter into a contract with Pender Construction to clear the land around the Storage Lot at a not to exceed cost \$11,180.
- 7) Approved an expense authorization to renew the Community's property, liability, equipment, Directors & Officers, auto, and umbrella insurance policies at an annual premium of \$47,997.
- 8) Appointed and re-appointed members to the Standing and Ad Hoc Committees. Updated list of members is available at the Office and Website.
- 9) Approved continuing the Memorandum of Understanding with the Shelter Bay Yacht Club for its use of Community facilities on a month-to-month basis.
- 10) Provided direction to the attorney defending the Community in an ongoing lawsuit over a view restoration decision.
- 11) Cancelled the regular July Board of Directors meeting.

- 2) Authorized renewing the Company's commercial property, liability, Directors and Officers, and umbrella policies at an annual premium of \$50,607.

## Manager's Corner - David Franklin

#### **Summer Projects**

Summer is construction time at Shelter Bay. Crews and contractors will be working on several projects during the dry and warmer summer months. As with all community work, residents are asked to use caution and keep a safe distance when driving or walking near work areas.

- **Road Work** Work this season involves numerous asphalt patch jobs in areas where we have experienced water line repairs and overlays to roadways in need, which include: Clallam, Hoh, Kalama, Kalispell, parts of Klickitat, Kootenai, Salish, Suquamish and Wanapum. Residents in the affected areas will be notified when dates are finalized for this work.
- Line Striping The Maintenance Crew will be re-striping the roads, including the yellow center lines, white fog lines and stop markings. Parking lot lines will also be refreshed.
- **Storage Lot** Work is scheduled to begin before the 4<sup>th</sup> of July and continue until October. Residents have been doing their part by removing property, some of which is being placed in communal areas where individuals do not have room on their lots or the steep nature of grades is prohibitive. Clearing of the perimeter of the Storage Lot is scheduled prior to the 4<sup>th</sup> of July with fence work, grading, drainage and electrical upgrades to follow. A new automatic gate will be installed, as well as security camera and lighting.



**Fireworks and Potential Threat of Fire** – Dry mid-summer conditions have already arrived in Shelter Bay and with it, the threat of wildfire. Please be advised that fireworks are strictly prohibited in Shelter Bay as is most outdoor burning activities, Please refer to Shelter Bay Rules and Regs Part I Section 2.4 for more detailed information: go to the Shelter Bay website @ www.shelterbay.net and click on the Governing Documents tab from the main menu.
