#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



A Special Spirit: Last night as I sat in our living room, I felt a sense of joy and satisfaction admiring our two Christmas trees. One tree is our traditional tree decorated as always with shiny ornaments and lots of bright lights including a silver star at

its peak. The other tree sits on our fireplace mantle. It is kind of scrawny, less than two feet tall, and decorated with one lone ornament. It's a Charlie Brown tree.

I would like to tell you the origin of that tree. A week before Thanksgiving 2010 I took a nasty fall from a ladder in our garage that resulted in a broken hip and shoulder. After spending 8 days at Harborview Hospital in Seattle and a month in a convalescent home in Bellevue, Vickie drove us home on a cold bleak December day shortly before Christmas. After hobbling into the house, I notice that it felt kind of bleak as well, cold with none of our usual gay Christmas décor. And then there was a knock at the door. It was Judy Colby, then President of our Shelter Bay homeowner association. She welcomed us home and then presented us a gift wrapped in a triangular box. Inside was the Charlie Brown tree, our Christmas decoration for that year. That tree shines with the special spirit of caring and support, and I believe it exemplifies the Spirit of this community.

**Road Sanding and Plowing Priorities -** The Shelter Bay Maintenance Department is equipped to plow and sand the roads when conditions require it. The plowing of the roads is prioritized according to traffic volume.

- **Priority One** is for Shelter Bay Drive, as it is the main arterial for the entire community, and it is essential to keep clear for emergency services.
- **Priority Two** roads are the collector roads providing service to community sub-areas, and includes Shoshone, Swinomish, Snohomish, Klamath, Lummi, and others.
- **Priority Three** are the remaining roads with limited access.

Depending on how severe weather conditions are, it may take a couple of days before the crew can get to these roads. There are a few roads that cannot be plowed due to the severity of the road slope such as Klamath Way, or due to extremely limited maneuverability as is found in some of the small cul-de-sacs. In severe weather conditions, residents may park their vehicles in the Shelter Bay parking lot, and the emergency exits on Muckleshoot-Indian Road, and Shelter Bay Drive-Pull and Be Damned will be open during the day.



Board of Directors Action Items

#### **Regular Meeting of December 18, 2019**

- 1) Adopted Resolution 19-13 revising Rules and Regulations, Part I General, the Social and Recreation Committee Guidelines, and the Fee Schedule to limit Clubhouse rentals to members only and to remove the requirement for paying a damage/security deposit.
- 2) Adopted Resolution 19-16 revising Rules and Regulations, Part I General and the Architectural Compliance Committee's Construction Guidelines to incorporate policy regarding requirements for private dock easements.
- 3) Adopted Resolution 19-17 revising Rules and Regulations, Part I General to codify the Community member's responsibility for determining their property lot lines.
- 4) Adopted Resolution 19-18 revising the Communications Committee's website and newsletter advertising guidelines to remove the option for real estate agents to place ads on the website due to a lack of interest in utilizing this opportunity.
- 5) Approved the FY 2020-2021 Budget Development and May 16, 2020 Annual Membership Meeting calendar setting deadlines and meeting dates. The calendar provides numerous opportunities for member participation in the budget development/approval process.
- 6) Authorized the expenditure of \$64,015 for Firewise fuel reduction work in several greenbelt areas by Precision Tree Service.
- 7) Approved the Community Manager's Annual Evaluation.

#### **Deadline for the Filing of Ballot Issues:**

Please be advised that any ballot issues proposed for consideration at the May 16, 2020 Annual Membership Meeting and Election must be received by Debbie Byrd, the Board's Executive Secretary by <u>5:00 p.m., Friday, January 31, 2020.</u> These include proposed amendments to the Articles of Incorporation, By-Laws, or the Protective Covenants which may be proposed by members or the Community Committees.

#### **Changes in the Protective Covenants by Member Petition:**

Per Article VI, Section 7, amendments to the Protective Covenants may be proposed by a petition signed by fifty (50) or more members in good standing. The proposed language contained in the petition does not require Board approval; however, it will be forwarded to legal counsel for review to ensure its legality prior to being placed on the ballot.

# Manager's Corner - David Franklin

**A and B Dock Project** – On Monday January 6<sup>th</sup>, the new A and B docks should be towed into the Shelter Bay Harbor Basin (weather dependent). If you haven't seen the choreography on water of a dock replacement, you should come down to the Marina or the new Gazebo on the Walking Path and have a look. The project will likely last 2 to 3 weeks before the docks are completely installed, and boats placed in their permanent slips on the new docks.

**Storage Lot New Hours** – Starting January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020 the Shelter Bay Storage Lot hours will be restricted to enhance security. The Lot will be open from 5:00am until 10:00pm. The reduction in hours has been recommended by our security contractor and the Swinomish Police Department, who will be called to the scene when an intrusion has been detected. Restricting hours at night will ensure Members do not cause false alarm events.

How to make Sense of the Dollars and Cents: Budgets for 2020-2021 - Soon after the Holidays the Board, Finance Committee, and Manager will begin work on developing the budgets for next year. We have made great efforts to encourage the Members to become more involved in the budget process by holding a series of Finance Committee Workshops and Board Workshops. Despite our best efforts, Member interest in the process has consistently been limited to only a handful of owners. Please consider attending one or all of the scheduled meetings at the Clubhouse:

1:00pm on Tuesday March 24th

1:00pm Thursday March 26<sup>th</sup>

1:00pm Tuesday March 31st (if needed).

In prior years, some Members have been disappointed when they attended the last meeting in the process, where the Board adopts the Budget, and felt that they could not suggest changes, even though the budget work sessions were held in advance of that date where Members attended. Moral of the story: get involved early in the process if you want your voice to be heard. We hope to see you at these important meetings.

Payment Deadline Reminder – One of the most common complaints the Front Office receives each month is from Members who receive statements that do not show their payments that were made a week or so after the end of new month. As a reminder, payments are considered past due if they are received after the last of the month and cannot be reflected on a statement that has already been printed and mailed. The payment will be reflected on the next month's statement. If you are paying with an online bill payment system from your bank, it can take up to 10 days for the bank to send a paper check. Consider using an automated electronic payment instead. Contact the Office for more information on options available to you.

**Do you know the boundaries of your lot?** - Knowing the boundaries of your leased or fee simple lot is essential information when adding, altering, or removing anything on your lot, especially if you are applying for a Shelter Bay Certificate of Compliance or a Tribal Permit. But, even member activities that do not require official approval can cause problems if you do not know your boundaries. In one recent instance, a member mistakenly cut down a hedge on his neighbor's lot, which he believed to be his.

For years, Members have been requesting that Shelter Bay provide them with their lot lines with many insisting that it is Shelter Bay's responsibility. A recent inquiry with the Community's legal counsel confirmed the fact that **members are responsible for identifying their lot lines** and ensuring that any work performed at their lot is done within that boundary.

In response for the need for clarification on this issue, the Board of Directors has codified this member responsibility into the Shelter Bay Rules and Regulations, Part I, as follows:

Members have possessory interest of their lot and are responsible for knowing and being able to verify the property lot lines. If the member cannot determine their lot lines, the member is responsible for having the lot professionally surveyed. The Community's responsibility is to provide the original survey plat maps and the lot's legal description.

Thank you to the Yacht Club for the wonderful Clubhouse Christmas Decorations - The decorations really enhanced the facility for those who took part in holiday gatherings and events.

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
