


### **Community Shredding Day**

### Vice President's Message



This month's President's Message is from the Vice President. I want to thank President Jack Galbraith, who resigned this month, for his efforts over the past year as President and wish him a wonderful Board retirement. This past year has been a whirlwind, with challenges and changes, which also present opportunities. I look forward to welcoming and collaborating with the new Directors as

we navigate the coming year together and as a team. I would like to provide a few updates on the hot topics that seem to keep the Facebook ads selling.

**LEASE** – Last summer, the Shelter Bay Board of Directors invited the Swinomish Indian Tribal Community (SITC) Chairman and Senators to meet. It was an introductory get-to-know you meeting with a little bit of history. The outcome was the decision to continue to meet in an even smaller group (4 Senators and 4 Shelter Bay Lease Committee Members – Jack, Louise, Steve, and Wendy) so that we could get to know each other better to facilitate lease negotiations. We have met several times since, most recently as last week, and we are committed to doing everything we can to negotiate a new master lease that is acceptable to all parties. I have had a positive experience in these meetings so far, and I look forward to future discussions.

**POOL** – I am as disappointed as everyone else that the pool is not open. My youngest has been enjoying this pool since she was a toddler. Please refer to Rick Tanner's pool article in this newsletter for an update on the current situation.

**RENT ADJUSTMENT** – The community approved the 2022-23 fiscal year budget, which included a doubling of the capital assessments (for capital improvements and facilities maintenance), along with a \$5.25/month increase in HOA assessments. In addition, the 10-year rent adjustment, projected to be almost double, will start being collected this month for the monthly supplemental rent and next May for the annual lease fee. <u>Click here</u> for the **Supplemental Rent Roll** or go to <u>shel-terbay.net</u> – log into Pilera and click *Budget and Financials* – click on the 1<sup>st</sup> document to the right – *FY2022-2023 Supplemental Rent Roll*. ### Dock Notes – July 2022

It's a busy month for the harbor and it's great to see activity on the docks as folks ready their boats for cruising, crabbing or just "condo-ing" in their slip. Please let Harbormaster Vanessa know if you see anything concerning or needing attention while you're at the Marina. She can generally be found on the docks or in the Harbor Shed (aka "Snack Shack -where a bag of treats awaits your pup). **You can also reach her by phone at 360-333-2952.** 

July brings the next phase of preparation for our autumn/winter dredging and dock replacement projects. Harbor Administrator Kendra will begin contacting boat owners from the F - J Docks about moving into newly available A - E Dock slips. As noted before, all boats currently moored on F- J Docks must move out of those slips in order for the dredging work to occur. We will accommodate some of the boats, temporarily, elsewhere in the harbor. Some boats are using those slips just for the summer season and will move out of Shelter Bay entirely. If you have a boat on F - J or anywhere else in the harbor and are planning a haul out or any major work to your vessel, October to December would be an ideal time to schedule that work.

### The new F – I Docks will consist of longer slip lengths as follows:

F = 55' slips on the south side and 50' slips on the north side

G = 50' slips on both sides of the dock

H = 50' slips on both sides of the dock

I = 44' slips on both sides of the dock

J = will remain configured the same with 48' slips both sides

We hope to have the new docks operational in January 2023.

### Pool Update Letter

There has been a lot of information circulating within our community on the state of the lower pool and I would like to highlight how we arrived to be in the current situation -

Last summer, Shelter Bay management initiated a pool inspection for liability and safety reasons

The inspection report was presented to the Swinomish Planning Department, along with a request for a Use Permit

Prior to this request, the Swinomish Planning Department had never issued a pool occupancy permit or requested that Shelter Bay obtain one

The Planning Department accommodated that permit request and the results of that inspection stated the condition of the lower pool would require many changes, upgrades, and improvements before a Use Permit would be issued

Existing pool pumps have been rebuilt 3 times and are no longer functional - Maintenance Supervisor, Bob Connelly, has determined that the pumps are not able to be rebuilt a 4th time and new ones are the only option

Shelter Bay Management determined that the funds needed to correct the inspection report issues would be much better spent on efforts to build a new, modern pool that is big enough to meet the community's needs

The Pool Implementation Team (PIT) continues to work towards presenting options to the Board for a new pool

I am as frustrated as anyone that one of Shelter Bay's best summer amenity is not available. A pool is part of summer fun and memories. For many, it has become a tradition here. I fully understand the expectation of every resident to have a pool they can both enjoy and also be proud of. Even if you do not use the pool, it's part of the value of your investment. We are working on all aspects of this situation and will continue to inform you on the situation as it unfolds. Respectfully, Rick Tanner General Manager

We are still eyeballs deep in major operational changes, with no break in sight.

Last week we eliminated our phones and are now on a computer-based system. So much for lands lines in the office. This change will save us about \$1 million a year! Not really, but does help lower the operating expenses.

We have a new facilities cleaning vendor starting this week that replaces a long-time vendor, but will crating costs.

also reduce our operating costs.

We have had a number of staffing changes that will help refocus our efforts in customer service, accuracy, and reporting. Still to join our team will be a new Administrative Assistant. Interviews are underway and we are excited about the level of interest. Over 50 applicants and counting.

Banking is another big change as we move our accounts from US Bank to Pacific Premier Bank. This change is based on the need for a closer relationship on the banking side and the added bonus of this bank's close relationship with eUnify. PPB also provided our recent marina loan.

The 900 lb. gorilla of change is still eUnify, our property management software package. This new system was selected ages ago and we have been working hard to prepare implementation. The new system will be running alongside the old system for the month of July as we work out all the bugs.

I anticipate many more changes as we navigate the unknown economy ahead. I hear the word "Recession" about a dozen times a day (I watch a lot of news). I want to insure we are doing all we can to position the Association to weather any possible storm.

Finally, the Board has experienced some big changes this election cycle with five new directors coming on to help lead the effort and one only three months in. For those leaving the Board I want to offer a sincere thank you for all your hard work. For those just joining, welcome, we will be going on quite the journey together.
