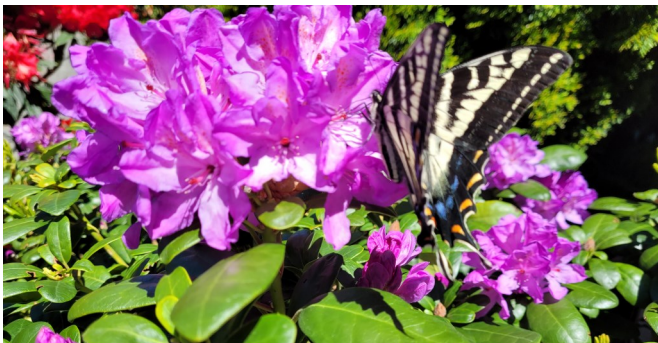

Thank you to everyone in the community who participated in the Annual Election. Voter turnout was 55%, all the ballot measures were approved, and the budget was ratified. I want to recognize our **Controller, Joseph Elkins**, along with our **Treasurer, Louise Kari**, and the **Finance Committee** for all the hard work and effort they put into gathering budget numbers from departments and committees to create the 2023-2024 budget. They did a fantastic job working with these groups to build an operating budget (not including Annual or Supplemental Rent) that addresses the needs of Shelter Bay while keeping the net increase to \$0. You can view the Annual and Supplemental Rent adjustments, which adjust per the Master Lease, on Shelter Bay's website under the Members – Budget and Financial section.

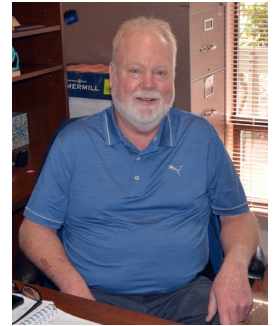

Manager's Report

Greetings from the Shelter Bay Community Office

Now that I have a few months under my belt I have had a chance to dig into a variety of items. As mentioned in my May article, one of the items I have been focusing on is the pool issues. This includes speaking with contractors about the refurbishment of the lower pool. We did receive one bid to make the lower pool functional but were subsequently advised that they would not be able to perform the work until sometime in the fall. Knowing the desire to have something operational much sooner, we are now speaking with another contractor who has indicated he may be able to do the work sooner. This contractor has been provided with as-built plans to help get a more accurate Bid. Will share additional updates as more information becomes available.



In the event the pool is not functional as soon as we would like, one of our Board members came up with a viable alternative. We met with Fidalgo Pool & Fitness Center in Anacortes to set up the outline of a program that would allow Shelter Bay residents to use that facility during the summer. This was presented to the Board, and they have already approved funding for this program. Details still to be worked out and will be shared as soon as possible.

Another area that I am focusing on is the Playground upgrades that were part of the Capital budget. We already have some bid information from a couple of companies that fit within the approved budget. However, it was determined that we should have community involvement to ensure that whatever we did would meet the community's needs. I have been working with Jim Barrett to see if we can have something put on the Shelter Bay Website that provides a few of the design concepts and asks for input regarding the types of equipment as well as locations. It would also be great to get input as to potential other locations where we might want to consider installing some smaller play areas.

I have learned that there are several roadways that also need attention. We have done a few repairs and I just recently gave the go ahead to do some work on both Klamath Drive and Palouse Place. We will do our best to give as much advance notice as we can when those two areas get scheduled.

Another item that we just recently completed was the hiring of another staff member to fill an open accounting position that was budgeted for. Once this person is onboard and up to speed, they will augment efforts of the existing staff allowing us to reduce the need for overtime and help to expedite the overall accounting function and to enhance customer service.

As always, I want to acknowledge all the staff that work here at Shelter Bay. They are a hard-working group of talented individuals and do their very best to serve the community. I also thank all the committee members that contribute their time and expertise to make Shelter Bay a great place to live.

Shelter Bay Marina moorage rates will increase by 9% on July 1st as required by the Community's vote to accept the 2023/24 fiscal year budget. The new rates remain competitive with other area marinas; similarly sized uncovered slips at La Conner Marina rent for 5% - 10% than Shelter Bay Marina. Community members receive a 10% discounted moorage rate.

NEW BOARD MEMBERS

Along with the ratification of the FY 2023-2024 Board approved budget, the Community elected the new board members. The meeting to seat the directors is July 5 due to the first falling on a weekend. Out of seven candidates, the following are newly elected Directors: Joe Hurley, Rick Parnell, and Rod Proctor.

Lawson Earl was appointed by the Board of Directors on May 18 to fill the open seat formerly held by Judy Kontos. Lawson’s term will be through 2025.

We would like to thank everyone who was willing to run and apply this year. Being on the Board is a time commitment that not everyone is able to do, so we appreciate those that can and do volunteer here in Shelter Bay.

We also want to thank the Election Committee for their service and integrity in the election process.

THE CANOE JOURNEY IS COMING!

Canoes from West Coast US and British Columbia tribes will paddle from their home locations to a final destination with the Muckleshoots, visiting along the way with the Swinomish and other tribes.

This year’s Canoe Journey visit will be from Monday July 24 to Thursday July 27. Event planners estimate that there will be an additional 800 to 1000 people each day in the Swinomish Village area. This could cause long waits to turn from Shelter Bay Drive onto Pioneer Parkway.

Shelter Bay has emergency exit gates off Muckleshoot Circle by the big green water tank, and off Shelter Bay Drive at Lillooet Circle. These gates are normally locked but will be unlocked for the Canoe Journey. If you use the Muckleshoot exit you can turn right onto Indian Road and up to SneeOosh Road. Or you can use the Lillooet exit, turn right onto Pull and be Damned, and up to SneeOosh Road.

Your Safety Committee recommends that you try these emergency exits during the Canoe Journey. If we have a wildland fire or other disaster requiring evacuation then knowing about these exits will get you to safety sooner and reduce the inevitable monster traffic jam at the Main Gate.

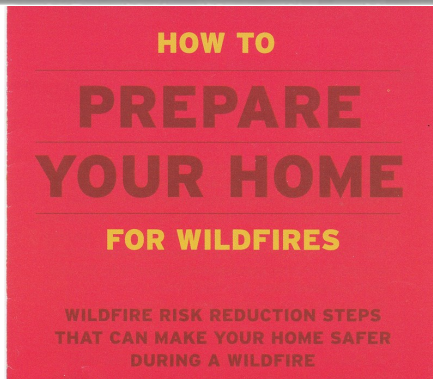

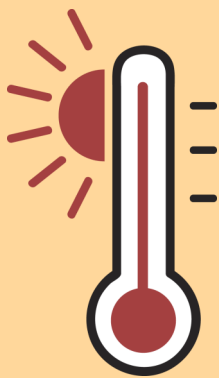

A Word from Fire District 13

Hyperthermia (body temp 101 degrees F or higher)

Normal body temperature is 98.6 degrees F and the heat regulating mechanisms of the body will usually maintain this temperature even when there are extreme external temperature changes through sweating and dilation of skin blood vessels.

Illnesses from Heat exposure usually manifests into **heat cramps**, **heat exhaustion** or **heatstroke**. Persons at greatest risk for these illnesses are children; geriatrics; individuals with heart disease, COPD, diabetes, dehydration, and obesity; and those with limited mobility. **Best Prevention** is drinking plenty of fluids at least 3 liters per day and ensure you are urinating frequently checking that your urine color is not dark (sign of dehydration) and staying in cool environment.

Heat Cramps – are painful muscle spasms occurring after vigorous exercise from the loss of essential electrolytes in cells. If this occurs move to cooler environment out of sun; resting area of cramps i.e., sitting or lying down; replace fluids with water or diluted Gatorade (or the like); and use a cool water or misting spray.

Heat Exhaustion – usually caused from heat exposure, stress, and fatigue from loss of water/electrolytes from heavy sweating in poorly ventilated or heavy clothing. Signs are dizziness, weakness, faintness, cold/clammy skin with ashen pallor, dry tongue, and thirst. If this occurs **Call 911** then remove excess layers of clothing particularly around head and neck; move person to cool preferably air-conditioned environment; splash person with cool water or misting spray; encourage person to lay down and elevate legs; and if fully alert encourage to drink water.

Heat Stroke – least common but most dangerous with body temperature rising rapidly to 106F or more and person’s level of consciousness falls possibly becoming unresponsive and seizures may occur with a weakening pulse. If this occurs **Call 911** move person to cool preferably air-conditioned environment then remove clothing: cover person with wet towels or sheets or spray person with cool water and fan him/her.



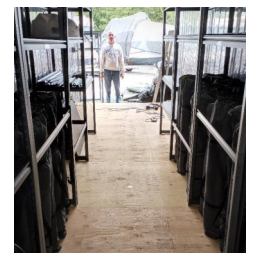

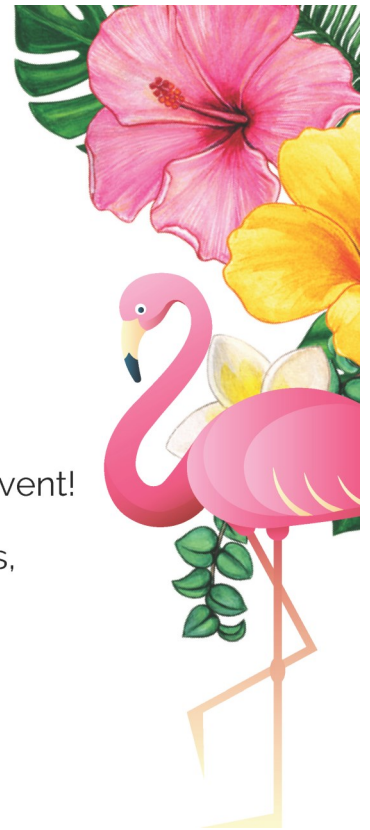
