Community Manager's Report

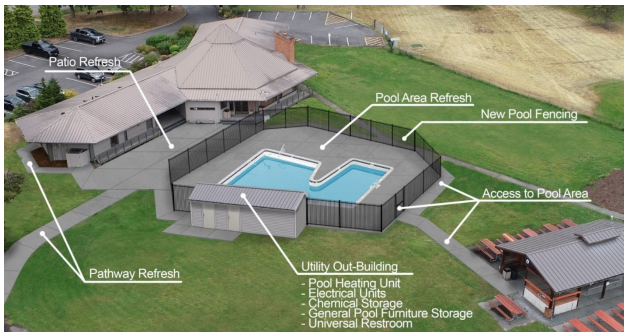
Greetings from the Shelter Bay Community Office

Things continue to move forward here at Shelter Bay with many of the projects that I inherited now starting to move forward.

We continue to make strides towards getting the pool back in shape to allow us to seek a temporary operating permit. We are pushing to get this done as quickly as possible but also ensuring we are following all the appropriate requirements to make this happen. In the interim we did roll out a program allowing Shelter Bay residents to utilize the Fidalgo Pool in Anacortes until such time that ours reopens. For additional information please contact Jennifer Peters here in the office. Big thanks to Elaine Dixon for putting this program together.

Additionally, as previously reported we continue to work with Contractors on plans for a more substantial retrofit of the lower pool area allowing for another 10+ years of operation.

Here is an aerial photo of what it may look like:



As you will see the overall layout will remain the same, however all the areas will be refreshed to include the pool deck, surrounding pathways, fencing, and we are also looking at moving all equipment to a new outbuilding.

As noted in my last newsletter Bob Connolly left us back in late June. With his departure we have promoted Robert Vandeventer to the role of Maintenance Supervisor. Robert has been with Shelter Bay for over 27 years and holds both Water and Wastewater credentials. Robert has shown a strong desire to provide top notch customer service and is open to ideas on various Shelter Bay projects that we all see as needing to get done. I look forward to working with Robert and his staff as we continue to move forward.

Another project that was previously reported on is the replacement of the Playground equipment. While we did ask for input from the community on this project, we received minimal feedback.

Here is an example of the pieces we are currently looking at:



The plan is to put this in the same location as the current equipment and to repurpose some of the existing equipment at other locations. We are looking to get this completed sometime this fall.

We recently completed a couple of road paving projects with more to come both on the roadways as well as in the Marina parking lot.

Lastly, I am now working on the Water Main replacement project and am working diligently on getting up to speed on the Bank Erosion issues along the channel.

As always, I want to acknowledge all the staff that work here at Shelter Bay. They are a hard-working group of talented individuals and do their very best to serve the community. I also thank all the committee members that contributed their time and expertise to make Shelter Bay a great place to live.

AED Automated External Defibrillator



The AED has been moved from inside the Clubhouse to outside the Clubhouse. An AED (automated external defibrillator) is used to help those experiencing sudden cardiac arrest. Easy to use, this medical device can analyze the heart's rhythm and if necessary, deliver an electrical shock, or defibrillation,

DID YOU KNOW? In the Marina there are two places where Community members might reuse - reduce -recycle items. An **OIL DISPOSAL TANK** is located between the Marina Restrooms and Harbor Shed in the C-D-E parking lot. Members and Marina tenants may dispose of used engine oil in the tank (no gasoline, solvents, or paints, please). The used oil is recycled quarterly. Interested in repurposing?

The Marina’s **TOO GOOD TO TOSS** area is located on the east side of the restrooms. Here’s the spot to drop off tools, boating or fishing items which have outlived their usefulness for you but might still have value for another. On a recent day you would have found socket sets, nautical charts, and a depth sounder. No household items should be dropped here unless of a nautical theme for boat use.

Protecting Our Shared Amenities

One of the reasons we love our Shelter Bay community is the natural beauty that surrounds us. To preserve such assets as the plants at Rainbow Park, we are fortunate to have a botanist at Skagit River Systems Cooperative who planned and is now monitoring the plantings that replaced those lost in 2020. *It is to be expected that up to half of the new plantings will not survive as they adjust to the soil conditions.* The four large trees are also guaranteed for the first few years and will be replaced if they do not survive. Our contract with SRSC includes monitoring, as well as the irrigation lines and plant identification signs that have been installed. Concerned community members are also periodically checking to ensure that the water lines have not been disturbed. DOGS on LEASH

A Word from Brad Stolzenburg, Compliance Officer
 Rules and Regulations 2.3 Dogs off members' or tenants' premises must always be leashed and under control at all times. Loose animals may be impounded. Pet owners are responsible for cleaning up feces left by their pets. Per Rules and Regulations, Part 1, General, page 5, 5.10c: Dogs may be allowed off-leash on Martha's Beach so long as the owner maintains complete control and picks up after them. If requested by a community member, the owner must put dogs back on their leashes.

Disc Golf Proposal



An idea for your consideration. Incorporating a Disc Golf course into our current regular golf course was an idea tabled in 2019 due to Covid, and it is now being revived as a possibility. This is just one of a couple of suggested layouts. Initially all that would need to be done is add 9-disc golf baskets; the tee areas could be shared. The golf greens and proposed disc baskets would be spaced apart so as not to interfere with one another. This is done purposely so that the golf greens are not in play with disc and vice versa with golf. If the basket locations are near trees when possible, this would play two roles: traditional golfers tend (or try) to avoid trees, while trees present a great challenge for disc golf.

The feeling is that both games can be played on the same course with minimal cross-interference. It would be more

efficient in the use of recreational space and could bring people together. Not everyone can swing a club, but most can throw a frisbee. Think of it like combining the tennis courts with pickleball.
