<u>Friday, January 31, 2025.</u> These include proposed amendments to the Articles of Incorporation, the By-Laws, or the Protective Covenants which may be proposed by members or the Community Committees.

### Changes in the Protective Covenants by Member Petition:

Per Article VI, Section 7, amendments to the Protective Covenants may be proposed by a petition signed by fifty (50) or more members in good standing. The proposed language contained in the petition does not require Board approval; however, it will be forwarded to legal counsel for review to ensure its legality prior to being placed on the ballot.

# Community Manager's Message



**Pool Update** – Work continues on the pool remodeling project. Most of the pool structural work is now complete, and work has moved into the areas surrounding the pool to include a new pool deck, walkways, fencing, etc. The weather continues to create some delays, but we are still estimating project completion sometime over the next few months. We will provide updates as more information becomes available.

**Playground**—There is nothing new to report. The new equipment will most likely be installed in the Spring.

Marina – As mentioned in last month's newsletter, Vanessa Finch, our outstanding Harbormaster, has retired, and we wish her nothing but the best in all her future adventures. Our new Harbormaster, Derek Woods, joined the team at the beginning of December and had the opportunity to train with Vanessa for the month before her departure. We are confident that, between Derek and Steve Shipley, the Shelter Bay Marina will continue to be the high-quality amenity that the Community and all our Marina Tenants have become accustomed to enjoying.

**Roads/Pavement**—Staff have been working on the Wanapum water flow issue. Initially, we were installing a trench drain to collect the surface water, but we discovered there was still water flow beneath the trench drain and have since changed directions. We are now installing a French drain. We believe this will perform better, collecting surface water and allowing water flowing below the surface to be directed to the drainage ditch further down the road. This project should be completed towards the end of December.

Maintenance Department—The drive-by Water Meter project continues with the delivery of 500+ water meter tops for our newer water meters. Staff are gearing up to begin the installation process, which should be underway in January. As always, the maintenance team remains busy with all the other areas for which they are responsible. They also continue to enthusiastically take on new tasks as they are identified.

Coquille Park — Progress on the remodel of the old pool building at Coquille Park is ongoing, thanks to community volunteers working under the direction of the Facilities and Amenities Committee. When completed later this winter, it will house a handicapped-accessible restroom, storage, and a large open room reservable as community recreational space. The most recent work includes installing a new cement floor, doors, and windows. Next will be the exterior finish, completion of electrical and plumbing, wall insulation, and interior finish. A big thanks to the volunteer construction crew that has been working diligently on this project and will continue to work on additional facets of the project. It was shared with me that the average age of the volunteers working on this project ranges from the mid-seventies to early eighties, which shows that you are never too old to contribute to the community.

We are exchanging improved land valuation information with the Swinomish and preparing for our appraisers to meet with the Tribal appraiser and hopefully close in on a value that works for both of us. January should see an increase in lease discussions and hopefully a Joint Statement on areas of agreement.
