- CodeRED: Alerts sent via Email, SMS, voice, Mobile App on the severity of the situation, time -sensitive information to individuals who have requested to receive alerts. Sign up for alerts or download the application at [www.onsolve.com](http://www.onsolve.com), or for a Skagit 911, WA focus enroll at <https://public.coderedweb.com/CNE/en-US/BF213B7CD4E3>. The CodeRED Mobile Alert App can be downloaded either on the AppStore or on Google Play.

- Purple Air: Air quality monitoring web site available at [www.purpleair.com](http://www.purpleair.com) that maps the quality of air down to the local level. Especially useful for tracking air quality related to wildfires.
