



**SHORE POWER CONNECTION CHECKS
REQUIRED FOR VESSEL MOVES TO A – C & F - I DOCKS**

- Any vessel obtaining moorage on A, B, C and F, G, H & I Docks is required to have an electrical check performed to ensure vessel compliance with the ELCI power pedestals on those docks. This inspection is necessary to ensure your shore power cord, receptacles and onboard circuitry is sound in addition to preventing loss of power to other vessels on the dock.
- The boat owner is advised to read the provided document “*What you need to know about ELCI-protected shore power*” in advance of moving to A, B or C Docks.
- The vessel can be moored at its assigned slip, however **the shore power cord shall not be connected without a Shelter Bay Marina representative present.** Representatives included the Harbormaster and volunteer members of the Harbor Committee. Representatives are available Monday – Friday, 8AM – 5PM, except on holidays. Weekend availability can be arranged. **It is recommended to call and schedule an appointment to ensure service.**
- Once the Shelter Bay Marina Representative is present, the boat owner may connect the shore power cord to the pedestal. If there are no issues, the vessel may remain connected to shore power.
- If the pedestal circuit breaker trips or there is no power available at the vessel, there will be one attempt to reset the circuit breaker. If the breaker trips again, **the shore power cord shall not be reconnected to the power pedestal as there is evidence of a grounding issue** with the shore power cord or vessel. At this point, the boat owner is advised to schedule the services of a marine electrician to remedy the issue.
- The Shelter Bay Marina representative will promptly advise the Shelter Bay Office as to the results of the initial electrical inspection
