#### Annual Membership Meeting/ Election

#### **Saturday, May 17, 2025**

Voting is now open for the Annual Membership meeting. You have 3 options for voting:

1) Online via Vote HOA Now

(Deadline Friday, May 16 at 4 p.m.)

- 2) By Mail-in using the ballots in the Election Packet (Must be <u>received</u> by Saturday, 10 a.m., including those mailed via USPS or those using After-hours Payment Drop Box at the Office)
- 3) In-person day of meeting (Must be in line (with ID) between 10:15-10:30 a.m. in the Clubhouse. As long as you are in line by 10:30 a.m., you will be allowed to vote.)

Online voting is the preferred method. It's a simple pointand-click ballot with the results automatically tabulated, providing the highest level of accuracy and security. You do not have to be signed up for electronic notices to vote electronically. Look for instructions in the Meeting Notice mailed to you.

The Annual Membership Meeting will convene at 10 a.m., Saturday, May 17, 2025 for in-person voting until 10:30 a.m., reconvening at 1 p.m. with the Election Results. Please vote – this is YOUR Community.

It is that time of year when Shelter Bay Company bills you for the annual leasehold rent required for your sublease. We will be processing automatic payments (ACH withdrawal) on May 15, 2025. If you are unsure if your account is set up for ACH withdrawal, there will be a message in the upper right corner of your statement stating, "If you are set up with auto payments, ACH, this invoice is for your records, no additional action is required." If you are paying Shelter Bay with a monthly check, please make your Annual Sublease payment to Shelter Bay Company. If you make the check out to Shelter Bay Community or combine the amount with your monthly HOA Shelter Bay Community payment, the check will be returned to you for correction.



# Community Manager's Message



<u>Pool Update</u> – The project has started to move forward more quickly. The weather is cooperating, and we were able to plaster the pool since the last newsletter. It is filled with water, and the pool equipment has been started. The decking and walkway areas around the pool still need to be completed and this should take place at the end of April. We have already scheduled a pool inspection for early May and hope to have it operational sometime in May. Big thanks to our project Manager, Lawson Earl, for keeping this important project on track. I also want to thank the Maintenance team, as they are once again doing the daily checks and routine maintenance that will keep the pool clean and looking good.



Playground—The playground project is still being worked on, and we will share additional information as soon as we have updates.

Marina—The Marina continues to have extremely high occupancy and comes in better than budget month after month. I want to thank Harbormaster Derek and his assistant Steve for installing all the remaining ladders. As a reminder, we rekeyed the Boat Launch lock and encourage anyone with a boat launch key to contact the office to swap their old key for a new one if they have not done so already.

Maintenance Department – The Maintenance Department continues working on various community maintenance issues. With the weather getting better and the grass growing very quickly, the team is spending more time mowing all the areas. We were also able to schedule ditch mowing for the middle of May. The team continues to work on installing the drive-by water meter tops, which are now up to approximately 150. This will be an ongoing project over the next several months. We hope to start on the installation of the full drive-by meters very soon. More recently, the team cleaned the pickleball courts, and will get to the tennis courts soon. We have a variety of other projects that the team will be working on now that the weather has improved.

**Roads/Pavement**— As you may have noticed, we recently had Fidalgo Paving onsite doing a lot of patching in various areas. While we start winding down the paving projects as we get closer to the end of this fiscal year, we will ramp back up as soon as we get into the new fiscal year. As stated in prior newsletters, areas will always need attention. We encourage you to report any potholes or other road-related issues to the office so we can ensure they are reviewed and addressed.

**Golf Course**—The Course is starting to look much better now that we have moved into spring and are once again mowing regularly. We recently engaged a company to fertilize and treat the course for weeds four times a year. We still plan to address the tee box/platform areas, and will continue to focus on irrigation to ensure it works properly as we enter the warmer months.

#### **Dock Notes**



Boating Season is finally here! Your Shelter Bay Marina staff wants to wish everyone safe and delightful times, whether island hopping, reeling in a monster fish, or just enjoying the sun afloat. Have any last-minute maintenance needs that have to be addressed? Stop by the harbormaster's office to get recommendations for professional divers, marine electricians, yacht detailers, etc. With all the increased activity going on

in the marina, please don't forget to pack your patience! Also, please drive slowly in our parking lots!

- Vehicles parked overnight at the Marina should display a parking permit decal. Marina parking includes these areas: near the boat launch & A Dock, at C/D/E Docks, and along Shoshone Drive at F-J Docks
- Parking in any shore-side spot at the Marina is limited to 72 hours.
- Tenants with boat trailers who use the parking area near the boat launch should have a trailer parking permit decal. Trailers cannot be left without a vehicle attached.
- Parking permit decals can be picked up from the office. Any questions? See our Staff.

Shelter Bay Marina Rates - Effective July 1, 2025 you will be out cruising and are willing to have your empty slip used by a visiting boater. Guest boats are charged \$1 per foot per night. Marina tenants whose slips are used by visitors will receive 50% of the collected guest fees as a credit towards their moorage fee.

> Moorage Rate Change: As a reminder, Shelter Bay Community's Board of Directors voted to increase moorage fees by 5% for the 2025-2026 Fiscal Year. This will take effect July 1. Marina tenants who are members of the HOA receive a 10% discount on moorage fees.

Here are some things to think about: Have you fallen in the last year? Do you find that you sometimes lose your balance or nearly fall? If you can answer


Yes to either of these questions, you're at increased risk for falls and now is the time to think about preventing future falls.

I want to remind the community that you can only have your trailer, RV, boat, or camper in your driveway for 7 consecutive days out of every 30. If you need it there longer, feel free to come to the office, and we can provide you with a permit.

In other news, we are scheduling Precision Tree Service to come and do work throughout the community this spring and summer. I am excited to have them work on some of the formed tree tunnels and the usual greenbelt clean-up. If you notice an area that needs attention, please submit a Green Committee Action Request form so we can take care of it!

# **EV Charging at Shelter Bay**

We are excited to announce the addition of Level 2 electric vehicle (EV) charging stations at Shelter Bay. These stations are compatible with all EVs and will enable marina tenants, Shelter Bay members, associate members, and their guests to recharge while enjoying our facilities.

The charging stations are located in the spaces surrounding the Harbormaster's office. Two spaces are reserved for active charging sessions, and vehicles should be moved when charging is complete to allow others to charge. The other two spaces are designated for EV charging and subsequent parking, with a maximum stay of 72 hours (a marina parking sticker is required), allowing weekend boaters to return to a fully

charged vehicle without needing to move when charging is complete. As this is a new program, we will monitor usage and adjust the rules if necessary.

Charging is a simple process; Tesla drivers can plug in and have billing handled automatically through their vehicle. Non-Tesla drivers can start charging using the Tesla app and selecting the Shelter Bay Community pin on the map. Instructions are provided at the charging stations.

Charging fees are based on the prevailing electricity rate (\$0.15 per kWh, as of the time of writing), plus billing services (\$0.03 per kWh), and a modest fee for cost recovery and maintenance (\$0.07 per kWh). The total fee will be adjusted when PSE issues rate changes. 
