- **CodeRED:** Alerts sent via Email, SMS, voice, Mobile App on the severity of the situation, time sensitive information to individuals who have requested to receive alerts. Sign up for alerts or download the application at www.onsolve.com, for a Skagit 911, WA focus enroll at https://public.coderedweb.com/CNE/en-US/BF213B7CD4E3. The CodeRED Mobile Alert App can be downloaded either on the AppStore or on Google Play.
- **Purple Air:** Air quality monitoring web site available at http://www.purpleair.com/ that maps the quality of air down to the local level. Especially useful for tracking air quality related to wildfires.
